

**ORDINANCE NO. 413-06**

**AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE NUMBERING OF BUILDINGS AND LOTS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ALTAMONT, ILLINOIS**

**WHEREAS**, The City of Altamont (hereafter "City") is authorized pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-80-18 to regulate the numbering of buildings and lots; and.

**WHEREAS**, after careful investigation, the City Council of the City of Altamont, Illinois, has determined that it is necessary to exercise its authority to regulate the numbering of buildings and lots within the corporate limits of the City of Altamont, Illinois.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALTAMONT THAT:**

**Section 1:** The recitals set forth in the foregoing Preambles are hereby adopted by the City Council for the City of Altamont, Illinois as findings of fact and are incorporated herein.

**Section 2: REQUIRED:** All lots, buildings, and houses within the corporate limits of the City of Altamont, Illinois shall be numbered in accordance with the plan set forth in this Ordinance.

**Section 3: BASE LINES:** The base line for streets running north and south shall be Main Street and numbers lying north or south thereof shall be designated north or south as the case may be. The base line for streets running east and west shall be Division Street and numbers lying east and west thereof shall be designated east or west as the case may be.

**Section 4: NUMBERS ASSIGNED:** Numbering pursuant to this Ordinance shall begin with the base lines with the number One provided, that, the numbers of each block thereafter shall begin with one hundred (100) or a multiple thereof. Odd numbers are to be on the north and east sides of the streets and even numbers shall be on the south and west sides of the streets.

**Section 5: DISPLAY OF NUMBERS:** It shall be the duty of the owner and occupant of each building, whether new or existing, in the City to have placed thereon, building numbers or approved building identification placed in a position that is plainly legible and visible from the right of way to which the building is addressed. All numbers shall be in arabic numerals and measuring not less than three inches (3") high with a minimum stroke width of one-half inch (1/2") that are visible from the street. These numerals shall be in a conspicuous place and shall be

reflective and of a color which can be clearly seen against the background on which they are mounted.

**Section 6: PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION:** Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be subject to punishment as provided in Section 1-1-20 of the Revised Code of Ordinances of the City of Altamont, Illinois, for each offense, and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues; provided, however, that no personal shall be liable for the penalty herein provided until after he has received from the City a notice sent to him by mail, or by personal service, of the fact that the building owned or occupied by him does not have the proper number to comply with this Ordinance.

**Section 7:** This Ordinance shall become effective upon its approval and passage as required by law.

**Section 8:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and may be published in pamphlet form as required by law.

**Section 9:** In the event that a court of competent jurisdiction finds that any provision of this Ordinance is invalid, then the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

**Section 10:** All ordinances or resolutions conflicting with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.


